TRADITIONAL IRISH CULTURE

The Temple Bar Trad Fest warms up winter days along with the Winter Music Weekend in Sixmilebridge and The Shindig in Tralee. In Summer head to Cavan for Fleadh Cheoil na hEireann – the biggest trad celebration of the year. Keep your toes tapping at the Ballyshannon Folk & Traditional Music Festival or Feile Oriel while in autumn the North West is the place to be for the Sligo Live Sessions.



THEATRE OR FILM

For theatre fans the Ulster Bank Dublin Theatre Festival, Cork Midsummer Festival and the Absolut Fringe in Dublin are the highlights. The Jameson Dublin International Film Festival, Galway Film Fleadh and the Corona Cork Film Festival feature the very best in Irish and International cinema with premieres, screenings, master classes and discussions all bringing you closer to the magic of silver screen.



MUSIC

Springtime delights include the Cork International Choral Festival and the Dublin City Soul Festival. The best of roots music comes to Kilkenny for the Smithwicks Rhythm and Roots Festival. As the nights get longer the stars of the jazz world arrive in Cork for the Guinness Jazz Festival while opera buffs head to Wexford for a truly boutique festival experience at the world renowned Wexford Festival Opera. The New Ross Piano Festival in the South East is dedicated to the beauty of piano music.

In Tullamore the enchanting surrounds of Charleville Castle host Castepalooza while Ballinlough Castle in Westmeath hosts Body & Soul Festival, and both bring music and the arts to intimate crowds.



BIG SOUNDS

Oxygen, the biggest music festival of the summer brings music by the world's biggest acts to massive crowds over three days – don't forget the wellies! Electric Picnic brings music, arts and imagination to little Stradbally. 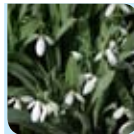

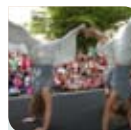

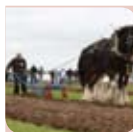
