VISITOR EXPERIENCE DEVELOPMENT PLANS FOR KERRY

Fáilte Ireland has initiated a number of Visitor Experience Development Plans across the country. These are 3-5 year commercial development plans for a region, which bring the public and private sector together to drive visitors and revenue to lesser known areas and attractions, especially in the off-peak season. These plans pull together stories, ideas, and opportunities that could be used to boost tourism and, vitally, will be delivered in a way that encourages visitors to spend more time in an area, without compromising the environment or culture of the region.


