Copyright & Data Protection Agreement for Contributed Imagery Form	<p>When imagery is supplied by third-parties, whether by for example, (trade, festival organiser, individual, local authority or an agency, convention bureau, local B&B, etc.), the provider of the images must sign this form before Fáilte Ireland can accept the Imagery.</p> <p>Example: Let's say that Joe Bloggs is a Tourism Officer and he wants to send Fáilte Ireland 12 images, Joe only needs to sign one Copyright & Data Protection Agreements for Contributed Imagery Form. Downloading Imagery from Ireland's Content Pool

Third-parties such as members of the trade and tourism groups wanting to download imagery must sign-up themselves to use the Ireland's Content Pool available at:
