Dublin's iconic DART (Dublin Area Rapid Transit) system offers a fast and frequent way to get to Dublin's coastal villages. The service travels along the picturesque Irish Sea coast for much of its journey with routes to Malahide and/or Howth in north Dublin, or southwards to towns and villages including Dún Laoghaire, Dalkey and further south to Bray and Greystones, County Wicklow. Leap Visitor card is valid for DART or purchase single/return ticket at any station ticket machines.

'Luas' (Irish word for speed) is Dublin's light-rail road crossing the city on two lines (The Red line and the Green line). Downpatrick Head is a majestic heritage site found about 5km north of Ballycastle village. Jutting out into the ocean and rising almost 40m above the waves, it provides unparalleled views of the Atlantic, including the unique collection of islands known as the Staggs of Broadhaven.

You can also spot the nearby Dún Briste sea stack, with its different coloured layers of rock and nesting sea birds. In addition to the natural scenery and wildlife, Downpatrick Head is home to the ruins of a church, holy well and stone cross, which together mark the site of an earlier church founded by St Patrick. Ireland's patron saint is also honoured with a statue that was built in the early 1980s.

The sea-stack is called Dún Briste (broken fort). Local legend says that when a pagan chieftain refused to convert to Christianity, St Patrick struck the ground with his crozier, splitting a chunk of the headland off into the ocean, with the chieftain on top!

WILD ATLANTIC WAY – SOUTHERN PENINSULAS

Start your day with a trip to UNESCO Skellig Michael.

"The most fantastic and impossible rock in the world" - George Bernard Shaw

Nine miles off Kerry's magnificent Iveragh Peninsula – where Ireland's highest mountain range sweeps down to the wild Atlantic coast – is one of the world: UNESCO **Skellig Michael**. 1300 years ago, early Christian monks built a remarkable hermitage at the top of this jagged ocean crag – then at the furthest limits of the known world. Steep steps are carved into the rock. Near the 213 meter (700 ft) summit is a collection of 'beehive' monastic cells: solitary places for contemplation and prayer, as far from the distractions of civilisation as it was possible to be. Today it is the setting for the Star Wars saga. Boats depart mid-May to October.

Allow from 0830-1500hrs weather permitting for this experience

In the **Skellig Experience Centre** you can experience many aspects of those offshore Skellig islands while remaining on dry land, in a custom built, stone clad, grass roofed, award winning building located right on the waterfront beside the Valentia Island bridge at Valentia.

Here, through re-creations and models you can study the works and lives of the Skellig monks of the early Christian period, their activities, their endurance and their dedication in gaining a foothold on a tiny, inhospitable, offshore island and creating a community there that survived for some 600 years. In the Skellig Centre's 80-seat auditorium, through a 14 min film presentation you can follow the footsteps of those Skellig monks, and wonder at the legacy of architecture they left behind.





The Skellig Experience Centre also includes a restaurant and craft shop.

Continue on your journey to **Derrynane House** – the ancestral home of the O'Connells and property of Hunting Cap, Daniel's uncle, who regarded Daniel as his heir. This location brings much of the O'Connell story to life – the love of his life, his wife Mary and the opposition he faced in marrying someone without a dowry, his passion for beagling, his role as landlord, his children, his interest in the traditional culture of song and story, and the way he restored himself physically and mentally on Iveragh.

Allow 2 hrs for this experience

Lunch in Caherdaniel village (Blind Piper) or Waterville

Continue to Waterville and take a guided walk along the Wild Atlantic Way with **Sea Synergy**, where a local marine biologist walks you through the rich heritage and wildlife of Ireland's western coast. Varying routes from flat sandy coastline to winding small roads to headlands and walkways hugging the Wild Atlantic Way to see shipwrecks and lookout towers and admire the local marine biodiversity of the area. (Optional seafood taster meal at family restaurant overlooking the bay at end of seashore walk.)

Allow 1.5 hrs for this experience

Dinner & Overnight Valentia or Caherciveen

DAY 4

WILD ATLANTIC WAY – SOUTHERN PENINSULAS & CLIFF COAST

Travel on to Tralee and visit the largest working windmill in Ireland **Blennerville Windmill**, (source: Guinness Book of Records). Now the centre piece of a major visitor attraction on the shores of Tralee Bay which includes an audio visual theatre; exhibitions on milling and Blennerville's role as a 19th century famine emigrant port. The centre also includes a model railway exhibition on the famous Tralee & Dingle Light Railway (1891 to 1953); a craft workshop and craft shop.

Allow 1 hr for this experience

Get back to nature at **Tralee Bay Wetland Centre** and take a boat tour and discover the wild flora, fauna and stunning natural habitat of Tralee Bay, a natural Irish wetlands adjacent to the Wild Atlantic Way. The boat trip guides you through the wetlands and includes a visit to a viewing tower that boasts panoramic views over Tralee Bay and out to the Atlantic Ocean.

DAY 1

WILD ATLANTIC WAY – BAY COAST

Built on the foundations of an ancient castle belonging to legendary Irish pirate queen Gráinne Mhaol, it's fitting that you'll learn about the area's rich maritime history inside **Westport House**. Today, its opulent rooms reflect the lifestyles of its more recent owners, including Maud Burke and her husband Colonel John Browne; they built the house we see today in 1650. Carry on into Westport Town when you're done exploring, and immerse yourself in the buzz of Westport. Peruse its shops, go for lunch and get to know friendly locals over a lively trad music session.

Allow 2 hours for this experience

Lunch in Westport

For those more adventurous continue your journey and escape the bustle of urban life on the 42km **Great Western Greenway** linking Westport town to Achill Island. This is the longest off-road walking and cycling trail in Ireland. Learn about EIRE 62 on the headland which assisted war-time pilots to identify the land as Ireland and the role Blacksod Lighthouse played in a critical part of WW2. You'll also hear the legends from the area, including stories about the Children of Lir.

Learn handicrafts at a workshop at Lúnasa Handmade Crafts in Belmullet. A delightful craft store and workshop, Lúnasa Handmade Crafts offers a unique opportunity to try your hand at a host of skills from their 'Give it a Go' menu.

Learn traditional Irish knitting, patchwork, spinning, weaving and many more vintage techniques from Rosaleen Bond, who loves sharing her passion for traditional craft revival.

Travel on to Downpatrick Head discovery point to see Dun Briste sea stack which was once part of the mainland. A storm in 1393 broke off part of the headland, its inhabitants having to be rescued by a ship's rope from the new sea stack 'island'.

Allow 30 minutes for this experience

Meet with **Rachel Nolan** in a traditional Irish Bed and Breakfast in Ballina. Roll your sleeves up and learn to make traditional brown bread and scones and enjoy them fresh from the oven.

Allow 1 hour 30 minutes for this experience

Dinner and Overnight in Ballina

DAY 3

Start your day with a walk along the seashore with expert guide Marc from **Sligo Seashore Secrets** who will lead a fun and informative seaweed identification walk in West Sligo. He'll not only show you how to identify the various seaweeds but you will also learn how to use them. At the end of the walk you'll enjoy a practical demonstration on how to cook and use the sea vegetables.

Travel to the coastal village of Easkey, Co. Sligo and visit **Rosie's Pottery Studio**. Rosie has been creating ceramic homewares, artistic pieces and lighting for more than ten years. eck of Cashel, Co. Tipperary

This is a tour of epic proportions, delving deep into our past and sweeping through more than 5,000 years of history. Along the way you'll be blasted with sea air at lighthouses, walk through haunting passage graves, visit iconic monasteries and get to grips with the mighty Vikings as they swept through the island. It's a journey that will bring you through dramatic green landscapes, peaceful gardens and lovely coastal villages. Welcome to Ireland's Ancient East.

DAY 1

Start your day at **Cork Harbour**, you can almost hear the history whispering on the salty sea breezes. Legend has it that around 1000BC, one of the first colonists of the island, Neimheidh, landed in the port of Cobh. He and his followers were wiped out in a plague, but **Cobh** has thrived ever since, and today is a colourful town with deep connections to the past.

As last port of call for the Titanic, as well as historic departure point for hundreds of thousands of emigrants over the centuries, Cobh's history is laden with heartache. Step inside the **Titanic Experience Cobh**, and **Cobh**, **The Queenstown Story** – to explore the story of both.

Allow 2 hours for these experiences

Lunch in Cobh

Heading north you'll pass through the busy town of Fermoy, with its 13th century Cistercian abbey, before reaching the horseshoeshaped **Lough Gur**. Rippling with myth and legend, the area here has a history stretching back 6,000 years. Look into the waters and see if you can see any sign of Gearóid Iarla, who was banished to the depths by the Goddess Áine... or so the legend goes.

Allow 11/2 hours to enjoy the sites of Fermoy and Lough Gur

Let the beautiful greens of the scenery wash over you as you drive into the heart of **Tipperary's Golden Vale**. Soon you'll see the **Rock of Cashel** emerging out of the landscape like a fairytale castle. It's one of Ireland's most iconic sites and as you walk up the steep hill to the entrance, you'll understand why. Huge, craggy and imposing – this is where St Patrick is said to have converted the King of Munster to Christianity in the 5th century, accidentally stabbing him in the foot with his crozier in the process. Explore the Gothic cathedral, see Ireland's oldest frescoes in the 12th century chapel and take in the stunning views of one of the greenest parts of Ireland.

Allow 1 hour for this experience

If you have more time: Stop off at Fethard Horse Country Experience, telling the story of the people of Fethard and county Tipperary through the generations from the arrival of the Normans to the present day of Coolmore Stud.

Allow 45 minutes for this experience

Overnight & Dinner Waterford city







DAY 2

Start your day in Waterford city. Often referred to as "Ireland's oldest city", Waterford was founded by Norse invaders in 914AD. In its Viking Triangle of historic monuments, you can trace the city's past within the fascinating trio of **Waterford Treasures**, including the Medieval Museum, Reginald's Tower and Bishop's Palace. Get up close and personal with the Viking warlords in a replica Viking house, at the world's first Viking Virtual Reality 3D Adventure – King of the Vikings.

Allow 2 hours for this experience

Walking around, you're likely to notice a "blaa" or two. Part of the city's history, it's thought that these tasty bread rolls were introduced by the Huguenots in the 17th century. Enjoy costumed afternoon tea at the **Athenaeum House Hotel** before hitting the road to New Ross.

Perched on the River Barrow, New Ross is a small but bustling place, anchored by the **Dunbrody Famine Ship**, a replica of an 1840s emigrant vessel. Step on board to uncover the truly emotional history of Ireland's emigrant past.

Allow 1 hour for this experience

Travel north to County Kilkenny, following the scenic route through the Nore Valley. Now you're into beautiful terrain studded with pretty villages, such as Thomastown and Bennettsbridge. Close by are the grounds of Mount Juliet, with its exquisite parkland golf course, fishing, archery and horse trails, as well as refreshments in The Manor House.

Continue to Kilkenny City, as well as its lively nightlife, great restaurants and traditional old pubs, Kilkenny's star is the **Medieval Mile Museum** – hear tales of witch trials, almshouses and besieged castles as you tour this city at a leisurely pace. Step inside the Medieval Mile Museum. Set in the 13th century St Mary's church, hear the stories of the wealthy merchants who ruled Kilkenny between 1200 and 1650.

Allow 2 hours for this experience

If you have more time: Make your way to Irish National Heritage Park. This outdoor museum depicts 9000 years bringing you on an unforgettable journey through Ireland's past and experience stories, sights and sounds that shaped Ireland.

Allow 45 minutes for this experience

Overnight & Dinner Kilkenny

DAY 3

Setting the tone perfectly for today is a tour of **Huntington Castle and Gardens**, to one of Ireland's hidden treasures. Built in 1625, this fascinating Castle is still lived in by the descendants of the original builders.

Allow 1 hour for this experience

Continue on to the "Garden of Ireland", where Wicklow's hills bloom with beautiful greens flecked with purple heather. But first, the town of Wicklow and its somewhat brutal tales from the early 18th century at **Wicklow Gaol**. Among them stories of convicts transported from Wicklow to Australia, sometimes just for the crime of stealing bread.

Allow 1 hour for this experience

From these so-called "Gates of Hell" back to the heart of Wicklow serenity in **Glendalough**, famed for its two lakes and spiritual atmosphere. At the monastic village, cast your mind back to what Glendalough must have been like in its heyday – when it was a retreat for peace-seeking monks. St Kevin first came here in the 6th century, and you get the sense that the landscape hasn't changed much since then. Walk to the water's edge at the Upper Lake, before heading to the fern-green hills around Poulanass waterfall, which cascades gently over mossy rocks. Back in the road, pass through the villages of Laragh, Annanoe and Roundwood and weave down towards Enniskerry.

Allow 11/2 hours for this experience





Lunch in Enniskerry

On the outskirts of Enniskerry is one of the county's jewels – **Powerscourt House and Gardens**. The magnificence of the estate here really is quite something, with its grand Palladian frontage and baroque domed towers – so much so that one architecture historian described it as possessing "the massive dignity of a great Italian Renaissance villa". Enjoy a coffee on the terrace, before stepping down the grand staircase into the world-famous gardens, complete with Japanese garden, pet cemetery and gracious statues. A perfect end to a perfect day.

Allow minimum 11/2 hours for this experience

If you have more time: Head to Russborough House and Parklands, one of the most stunning Irish houses open. This stunning Palladian mansion of nearly 300 years of grandeur has survived two forced occupations, two fires and four art robberies.

Allow 11/2 hours for this experience

Dinner & Overnight Wicklow

DAY 4

From one grand expanse of green to another – this time into the heart of Ireland's horse country in County Kildare. The flat pastures of **The Curragh** have made it world-famous for its thoroughbreds, and it has one of the finest racing tracks in Europe – so get to a race day if you can, or tour early in the morning and witness the spectacle of long lines of thoroughbreds training across miles of flat, rich plains. There's still plenty of equestrian-related enjoyment to be had nearby at the **Irish National Stud**, where the winners of five Classics were produced and the tale of William Hall Walker is revealed. A true character, Walker used astrological charts to determine the futures of his foals – any born under an undesirable chart were sold. Move from horses to horticulture next at the Japanese Gardens. Designed to represent the "Life of Man", the gardens were created by Japanese master horticulturalist Tassa Eida, and help you to adjust and adapt to a slower, more peaceful pace. Walk the tranquil woodland and wetlands of the restful St Fiachra's Garden.

Allow minimum 11/2 hours for this experience

Take a walking tour with a difference at Lullymore Heritage & Discovery Park. Hear the story of Irish Peatlands and try your hand at some traditional turf cutting and enjoy a trip on the Peatland heritage railway.

Allow 1 hour for this experience

Continue to Laois's **Emo Court Demesne**. Here, listen for the echoes of the 1798 Rebellion that once permeated the stillness of these magnificent neoclassical parklands. West again, past the scenic **Slieve Bloom Mountains** and through the village of Kinnitty, which according to legend has the head of a princess buried beneath it.

Allow 11/2 hours for this experience

Lunch in Kinnity

Head for **Birr Castle**, which, resides firmly in the realm of science with its huge Great Telescope sitting at the heart of this vast and beautiful demesne. Designed and built in the 19th century by the Third Earl of Rosse, this telescope was the largest in the world from 1845 to 1914 and was appropriately known as the "Leviathan". Finish the day with a walk through the gardens, which bloom with roses, wisteria and 300-year-old box hedges.

Allow 11/2 hours for this experience

If you have more time: Make your way to The Rock of Dunamase. A gift to Norman Lord Strongbow in 1170 upon his marriage to Aoife, daughter of the King of Leinster, **The Rock of Dunamase** has got to be one of Ireland's most impressive wedding presents. As legend goes, there's even buried treasure lying beneath the castle – guarded by a fearsome hellhound.

Allow 30 minutes for this experience

Dinner & Overnight Birr





Athlone Castle, Co. Westmeath

DAY 5

The bones of Christian saints and ancient kings rest side by side at **Clonmacnoise**, founded in 544 by St Ciarán. This site by the River Shannon has withstood raids by unruly Gaels and plundering Norsemen during the centuries, but also managed to produce some impressive sacred texts along the way.

Allow 45 minutes for this experience

The Viking Longships have been sailing on our rivers since 795. Step aboard with Viking Tours, a heritage boat, which brings you back 1,200 years to cruise the majestic River Shannon from the quayside at Athlone Castle to Lough Ree, the 'Lake of the Kings'.

Allow 1¼ hours for this experience

Move from round towers to regal battlements at **Athlone Castle**. The fortress was built in the 13th century in honour of a visit by King John of England, who never arrived! Don't emulate the monarch, though: the keep and walls of this historic site now house a lively museum and are not to be missed.

Allow 11/2 hours for this experience

Lunch in Athlone

Let the past light your way at the **Hill of Uisneach**, Ireland's "mythological and sacred" centre, where even today the pagan fire festival Bealtaine is celebrated to herald in the summer. An ancient belief suggests that rocks from Uisneach were used in the construction of Stonehenge. From rocks to bog next as you move on to the **Corlea Trackway**, surrounded by wild terrain. This bog road was built from oak beams in the iron age, some say to carry cargo, others for sacred ceremonial purposes. Follow in the footsteps of our most distant ancestors when you reach this structure that has lasted through the millennia.

Allow 11/2 hours - 2 hours for this experience

Dinner & Overnight County Meath

DAY 6

Start your day at Loughcrew Cairns the unsung stars of Ireland's Neolithic era, and explore the Cairns' ancient artwork, the Hag's Chair and hear the legend of a witch.

Allow 11/2 hours for this experience

Next, and in the middle of a swathe of pristine green fields lies a site that touches at the very heart of Irish history, the **Hill of Tara** – a place with a 5,000-year history, ancient seat of Ireland's High Kings and capital of the mythical god-like race of Tuatha Dé Danann.

Allow 45 minutes for this experience

Equally haunting are the passage tombs and sweeping vistas of your next stop: the UNESCO World Heritage Sites around **Brú na Bóinne**. Admire the views with a light lunch in the Visitor Centre, before you enter this treasure trove. Once you've come to terms with the archeological feat that is Newgrange, discover the artistry and secrets of the nearby Great Mound of Knowth, which also dates to 3000BC.

Allow minimum 2 hours for this experience

Keep the monastic theme going at **Monasterboice**, founded in the late 5th century by St Buithe. The big draw here is the magnificent Muirdeach's High Cross: divided into panels decorated with vivid and lively scenes. There are 124 figures on the cross, but only one appears in headgear – see if you can find Goliath in his conical hat, as well as the few other bearded characters, Adam, Cain, Moses and Saul.

Allow 45 minutes for this experience





Carlingford's Peninsula is next and aim straight for the Carlingford Heritage Centre, found in the beautifully restored medieval church of the Holy Trinity. Starting from 850AD, you can uncover the incredible story of Carlingford from its Viking beginnings to the present day, before soaking up the views from the hillsides. Or you could take to the water for some high-speed thrills with **Carlingford Boat Tours**.

Allow 11/2 hours for this experience

If you have more time: When it comes to grisly relics, none is more legendary than Saint Oliver Plunkett's preserved head in St Peter's Church Drogheda – a must visit in this County Louth town.

Allow 30 minutes for this experience

Dinner & Overnight County Louth

DAY 7

Sprinkled with lakes and beautiful scenery, County Monaghan is one of Ireland's lesser explored counties but is full of hidden gems. For starters, it's also the site of one of Ireland's most delicate and intricate crafts – lace making. Here in **Carrickmacross** in the 1820s Mrs Grey Porter of Donaghmoyne introduced it as a way for local women to make money. Since then, industry flourished and over the years the lace was favoured by royalty, from Queen Victoria to Princess Diana. The lovely, hand-stitched lace is still a prized possession today.

Allow 45 minutes for this experience

Onwards to tranquil Lough Oughter and Killykeen Forest Park, where anglers, hikers, walkers and cyclists can breathe in the absolute beauty of this County Cavan spot. There are more incredible landscapes, too, when you move onto the Cavan Burren Park, part of the Marble Arch Caves UNESCO Global Geopark. Within this fascinating prehistoric limestone landscape fossils from a coral sea 350 million years ago have been found, while human habitation can be traced back to Neolithic times. With five walking trails through this exceptional landscape, you can explore at your own pace, or step into the past with a guided tour from one of the very knowledgeable Geopark guides.

Allow 2 hours for this experience

If you have more time: Drop into Cavan County Museum, a centre showcasing the unique heritage and culture of county Cavan, spanning over 6,000 years. Here you will find the World War One Trench Experience.

Allow 45 minutes for this experience-

Phoenix Park: The Phoenix Park is over 700 hectares (1752 acres) in area and is the largest enclosed public Park in any capital city in Europe. A large herd of fallow deer still remain to this day. The Park is also home to the Zoo, Áras an Uachtaráin where the Irish President lives and Victorian flower gardens. DAY 1 DUBLIN BAY MEETS DUBLIN CITY WITH A BREATH OF FRESH AIR (SUITABLE FOR GROUPS & FITS)

MORNING & LUNCH

After a hearty Irish breakfast, take a trip out to one of the city's picturesque coastal villages – where you can breathe in the sea air and get up close and personal to the locals. The pretty village of Dalkey on the southern tip of Dublin bay is a 25 minute DART coastal train journey (now available with Dublin's single transport ticket – Leap Visitor Card) from any of the city's DART stations.

A key element of experience is the rich lore of Dublin's pubs and the role they played as social centres for many trades, including writers and journalists. The performance is punctuated with song and anecdote and is set against a backdrop of wonderful photographs of the city. With his witty, enthusiastic and informative style, there is always the chance that he will veer off the mark and into subjects that would never be covered in any tourist guides or brochures, such as Eamon de Valera's signing, in 1945, of a condolence book for Adolf Hitler!

In 2016 we commenced a standards review, commencing with hotels. Revised Hotel Regulations were introduced in August 2016 and, following on from this, Fáilte Ireland, in conjunction with the Irish Hotels Federation, have implemented new Hotel Classification Criteria, from two to five star.

These new criteria provide opportunities for flexibility in the manner in which hotels meet the needs of the modern traveller. With the increase in visitor traffic to Ireland there is demand for both 'traditional' hotels and new hotel styles to meet consumer needs. These new regulations and classification criteria provide opportunities for our industry to innovate competitively through new hotel concepts and offerings. In 2017, Fáilte Ireland is reviewing the standards for both self-catering holiday homes and camping sites with similar objectives to improve capacity and range.

In a change of policy, Fáilte Ireland will also seek to work closely with all distribution channels carrying inventories of approved visitor accommodation

stock. It is recognised that such distributors may simultaneously carry stock for purchase which is not approved by Fáilte Ireland, however, such is their importance to the 'approved sector' that Fáilte Ireland considers it prudent to engage fully with all such distributors to enhance the promotion and marketing effort. - 11
